Shaun R. Harper has professional experience in academic program administration, graduate admissions, and undergraduate student affairs. He studies topics pertaining to race and gender in education and social contexts, equity trends and climate issues on college campuses, Black and Latino male student success in high school and higher education, college student engagement, and intercollegiate athletics. Dr. Harper has published 12 books and over 100 peer-reviewed journal articles and other academic publications, and procured over \$12 million in research grants and contracts. His research has been cited in over 4,000 published studies. He participates in multiple national associations via board memberships, editorial leadership, committees, and conference presentations. He is President-Elect of the Association for the Study of Higher Education. *The New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *Wall Street Journal*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Chronicle of Higher Education*, and over 11,000 newspapers have quoted Dr. Harper and featured his research. He has interviewed on CNN, ESPN, CSPAN, and NPR.
